

COMP METRICA Work Applied French Test



This exercise is ideal for organizations that operate in a bilingual environment and are seeking to assess a candidate's capacity to interact within a French work environment. During this exercise, candidates are expected to complete eighty (80) questions intended to assess their ability to communicate in French with an emphasis on spelling, grammar and lexicon. All assessments are corrected by qualified specialists who possess a Bachelor's and/or a Master's degree in Linguistics and/or Languages.

Description

- The candidate must answer eighty (80) multiple choice questions.
- The Work Applied French Test assesses the following three aspects: spelling, grammar, and lexicon.

Type of Report

The report presents the overall results as a percentage score and a result out of 5. Results are also presented graphically by sub-element for each element measured (spelling, grammar, lexicon).

Explanation notes on the type of test

The Work Applied French Test - version A (WAFT-A 05A) measures the level of mastery of the French language. The test questions relate to the French language elements that can be seen in the workplace. Three major language criteria are evaluated: spelling, grammar and lexicon.

This exercise is composed of a series of 80 multiple-choice questions. The candidate must indicate which of the five responses presented is the right one. The Work Applied French Test measures the degree of mastery with regards to the following aspects: knowledge of the written form of the words, application of the various rules of concordance and the use of the right words according to the context.

This exercise does not assess the specific knowledge for this field of employment.

Definition of the evaluated components

The WAFT evaluates the **WRITTEN COMMUNICATION** competency, meaning the capacity to express one's ideas in a written format using appropriate language that is free of errors in order to transmit the information effectively. More precisely, the test measures the three following elements:

- SPELLING** → The common spelling refers to the usual spelling of a word.
- GRAMMAR** → Grammar corresponds to the rules that govern the use of words in a sentence. It also includes the rules of syntax and agreement.
- LEXICON** → The lexicon includes elements such as definitions and homonyms, as well as vocabulary errors (anglicisms, barbarisms).

The following elements were considered by content experts during test validation; based on defining intended levels of difficulty, question clarity, exactness of answer/response, pertinence of false answers/response, and pairing with the evaluated criteria.

A group of French language and assessment specialists have created a bank of multiple choice questions designed to assess fluency in the French language. A final 80 questions version was produced.

Global Result

The global result indicates the number of questions correctly answered for the three elements evaluated and is presented in percentage form. The suggested passing mark for this test is 60% (but this can vary in function of the organization), which signifies that the candidate adequately demonstrates the capacity to express their ideas in a written format within the context of the workplace.
