Description

- Each theme contains fifteen (15) questions.
- The nature of the themes and questions for the **Oral Communication Test** is designed to assess the candidate's comprehension and oral expression based on their vocabulary, verb, syntax, rhythm, logic, and level of English.
- Questions of varying in difficulty evaluate the candidate's knowledge of the English language in terms of comprehension and expression.
- The **Oral Communication Test** is conducted through a telephone interview involving the candidate and a Compmetrica professional and can easily accommodate to the candidate's schedule.

A score is attributed for each of the six evaluation criteria with regards to "Expression." Also, a global score is provided with regards to the candidate's comprehension of the English language.

EXPRESSION

VOCABULARY
 > **Expression : Level of language 3**
 The candidate uses simple vocabulary which allows him to make himself understood by the interlocutor even though his choice of words is simple and sometimes inappropriate. As a result, the interlocutor must sometimes ask for explanations.

RHYTHM
 > **Expression : Level of language 2**
 The candidate's rhythm of speech is not always appropriate. Moreover, his use of intonation, sentence stress and syllable stress is often inappropriate. The interlocutor often has difficulty following the flow of the conversation. The latter often asks the candidate to repeat what he said or to explain himself.

REASONING
 > **Expression : Level of language 4**
 The candidate is able to link his ideas coherently and his reasoning is objective and allows him to make himself understood by the interlocutor.

VERBS
 > **Expression : Level of language 3**
 The candidate's use of verb types, tenses and forms is appropriate although he demonstrates some gaps in this area. The interlocutor understands the idea but must sometimes ask the candidate for clarification. The use of verbs is not always
